

Victoria June 13th 1862

Dear Morris

Yours from this day came duly to hand, and contents duly noticed, as regards to grumbling, we had no such intention, it was My self your Brother who takes it upon my self to give you a brotherly adwaisee, and will do same again when ever I think proper, on less you - as My brother (half of My age) will say to me dont give me any adwaisee - and will also say that you know better - I will then stop and say no more "—" as for sending you up the rest of your goods with the addition of 0 & 1 Fry Pins & Cloth Lines & small rope - we have no order from you for any goods on our our order Book & will send only those mentioned articles but if you want any thing Ells sent to you you will please wite what you want and we will forward it to you hoping to hear from your prosperity
